





### FERTILIZATION: JOINING OF EGG AND SPERM NUCLEUS FORMING A ZYGOTE.



#### IMPLANTATION: FERTILIZE EGG (ZYGOTE) ATTACHES TO THE

UTERUS.



## CLOSURE: ARRANGE SEQUENCE IN ORDER.

- Sperm cells swim up the vagina through the cervix
- Sperm nucleus and egg nucleus forms the Zygote.
- Implantation occurs and zygote develops into an embryo.
- Ejaculation of semen into vagina
- Zygote then moves from fallopian tube to the uterus and attaches itself.
- Sperm cells pass the uterus into the fallopian tube
- Sexual intercourse
- Sperm meets the egg cell and fertilize.


- A.Allow the embryo to obtain materials such as oxygen and nutrients from the mother's blood.
